Oil and gas work sites defined

Information for employers and prime contractors

This resource defines oil and gas work sites for the purposes of the *Occupational Health and Safety* (OHS) Act section 10(1).

Key information

Oil and gas work sites with two or more employers or self-employed persons (or a combination of these) involved in the work require a prime contractor.

The OHS Act requires an oil and gas work site with two or more employers or self-employed persons (or a combination of these) involved in the work at the site to have a prime contractor.

Oil and gas work sites include:

- geophysical operations
- lease, road or facility construction
- drilling, completion, servicing, testing and operation of oil and gas wells
- site abandonment, remediation or reclamation
- pipeline construction and operation
- gas storage
- extraction, upgrading and refining of oil sands
- in-situ heavy oil and bitumen recovery (e.g., SAGD)
- downstream refining and processing of oil and gas products

Oil and gas work sites do not include:

- coal mining
- power plants
- retail sale of oil and gas or finished products
- manufacturing and transportation of oil and gas equipment
- low-risk office environments

Every construction and oil and gas work site or a work site designated by a Director must have a prime contractor if there are 2 or more employers or self-employed persons, or one or more employers and one or more self-employed persons involved in work at the work site.
