

Application for approval to teach **ADVANCED workplace first aid training**

Minimum practical skills – 35 hours (not including instructional theory time)

Alberta Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) approves workplace first aid training in Alberta. Use this form to apply to teach advanced workplace first aid training.

Make sure your application meets the requirements below. OHS will not review or approve incomplete applications, or an application form that describes more than one course.

Note that a medical advisor must review the course materials and sign the application. (See below.)

Application requirement	Notes
Provide key information: agency name, course name, delivery method.	One application form for each course. Agencies choose course names.
Medical advisor reviews course materials to confirm that topics and competency levels meet CSA Standard Z1210-17 <i>First aid training in the workplace – Curriculum and quality management for training agencies</i> .	Topics and competencies are set out as line items in the application form. The medical advisor must verify that <u>every</u> topic and competency level in the course materials meet the standard. OHS will not review or approve applications with missing topics or competency levels.
Medical advisor signs the application form.	Signature confirms the medical advisor's review and that the course materials meet the standard's requirements.
Attach a course certificate template that follows clause 7.10 of CSA Standard Z1210-17, and gives the course name.	The course name on the certificate must match the course name in the application form and on the agency's website.

Do not include course materials with the application.

How to submit your application: Use the OHS [Acceptances and Approvals](#) secure online feature. You can enter and upload all required information directly, and track the status of your application.

Note: A medical advisor is a licensed physician with relevant experience, in good standing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta, or other provincial or territorial licensing body for physicians.

Instructions

Agency: Provide agency and course name, and the course delivery method (for example, in-person, blended or recertification).

Medical advisor: Review the course materials against all mandatory CSA Standard Z1210-17 curriculum requirements. Verify with a checkmark that each topic/competency and competency level is met. Use the “Comments” fields to provide any relevant additional information.
